The submission of proposals will be accepted for panels or papers describing theoretical advances, applications, case studies, or general knowledge on any topic directly relevant to the ethics of national security intelligence activities. These activities can involve a governmental entity or private sector firm working in conjunction with governmental entities. The Program Committee is especially interested in the following topics that include the **ethical considerations** of:

- Intelligence support for counterinsurgency operations
- Counterintelligence
- The use of private sector firms to conduct intelligence activities for national security purposes
- Warrantless surveillance of domestic and international communications
- The media coverage of intelligence activities
- Intelligence operations and the cultural, religious, and ideological context of ethical norms
- Recruiting sources of information and evaluating asset validation procedures
- Intelligence activities in territorial waters, exclusive economic zones, and the high seas
- Secrecy and the classification of national security information.

Proposals or abstracts should be sent with a brief biography of the proposed speaker(s). Proposals and abstracts should be of sufficient length to permit a careful review by the Program Committee. Submissions must be sent in Word or Adobe PDF format via e-mail to [conference2010@intelligence-ethics.org](mailto:conference2010@intelligence-ethics.org). Submissions must be received no later than OCTOBER 1, 2009. Presenters will be notified of the acceptance of their proposal no later than November 1, 2009.
